### RECOMMENDED READING – a selection

Artmakers' mural *WHEN WOMEN PURSUE JUSTICE* celebrates 90 women who have led or participated in movements for social change in the United States over the past 150 years. Native and foreign-born, Native American, and women of color, these women often risked life and liberty to achieve voting rights, civil rights and racial justice, health and reproductive rights, gay rights, immigrant rights, environmental justice and protection, and workplace/arts access and equality. *When Women Pursue Justice* honors 14 twentieth-century movement leaders (including Shirley Chisholm to whose memory the mural is dedicated), an additional 67 activists and 9 *ancestors*, nineteenth-century women who inspired twentieth-century activism.

The **CENTRAL LIBRARY YOUTH WING** has an outstanding collection of young readers books about many of the women in the mural. They are available on a special book cart for the duration of this exhibition (Feb 1 - Mar 26).

Artmakers is preparing a **48-page illustrated booklet** with short biographies of the 90 women in the mural and a viewing guide. It will be available in late March.
